



Top UK construction company builds on partnership concept with Century

How does a major UK construction group with 6 national offices and around 30 construction sites at any one time, all connected and supporting 300 computers (running everything from commercial applications to complex CadCam applications) run successfully with a minute IT department? Easily, according to Derek Hine, Group IT Development Manager, Briggs & Forrester - it's all to do with outsourcing much of the IT support to a trusted business partner.
